This includes offering education on various patient safety related topics including patient safety event management and reporting, culture of safety, and disclosure of patient safety events.

About Culture of Safety - A culture of safety consists of the shared values, attitudes, and patterns of behaviour regarding safety. A better culture means better outcomes for our patients and fewer adverse events. Evidence shows a concrete link between strong teamwork and increased safety and quality of care. Safe health care services are the result of teams working together with patients/clients/residents and families to address safety concerns in a proactive, solution- focused manner.
